#### REPORT ON THE LAST MEETING

Superintendent **Dave Anderson** called the meeting to order at 7:00 on Thursday, April 4, 2013

He thanked all who went to Hickory (**Fred, Charlie, Boyce, Tom, Kevin, Mike Devore**), for their help. The team was able to pack up very quickly which was nice. It was a good size show, with lots of people and vendors. The afternoon the number of people slacked off, but our host was very pleased with the turn out, which exceeded last year. (Good for them)

The topic of standards for the modules was discussed with more details to be developed. We discussed having a repair log for rolling stock, and it was decided for now that the B end will be where the brake wheel is. If anyone has the real designation, please tell us. The A end will be the opposite end from B end.

We discussed what a 1:1 scale railroader's definition of operating at reduced speed means. Most people got part of the definition correct. The definition was from 1967 and the Southern Railroad, although it should not be that different for any other railroad is "means you must go slow enough to stop before hitting any train, engine or obstruction which happens to be ahead of you on the track."

Nothing was brought up from the floor for discussion.

We then went straight into **Gordon Fewster**'s presentations. First was weathering wheels and trucks and adding weights, then train watching spots in the area, which will help anyone wanting to railfan the upcoming run of Southern 630, and some train chasing of Southern Consolidated (2-8-0) #630 from Chattanooga to Summerville, GA. It was all well presented and informative.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday, May 2nd at 7:00 pm.

#### REPORT OF THE QUARTERLY BOARD MEETING

The financial results of our train show were discussed. Several suggestions to improve the event next year. By all measures the event was a success. Thanks was given to **Fred Coleman** for leading us to a very successful weekend.

The board also agreed to allow non-members to bring items for sale at the Company Store. The items would be priced, an inventory sheet submitted, and the club would take 20 of the proceeds. Current policy limits this activity to club members with a 10 percent share going to club.

The board will be drafting some standards for LOST RR equipment, members running trains on the modules. The intent is to improve the reliability of the layout and minimize breakdowns. More to follow.

Fred Coleman was asked to chair the nominating committee for this year's election.

#### **GE to Reduce Production at its Erie Facility**

General Electric recently announced plans to reduce the size of the work force at its Erie, PA facility and shift some work to a more modern facility in Fort Worth, Texas, due to reduced demand for its heavy locomotives. Part of the problem is a reduced demand for coal. In recent years, GE has been a dominant player in the manufacturing of high-horsepower six-axel diesel locomotives, typical power for coal trains.
