And when we receive donated cars, we usually upgrade them to with Kaydee couplers and metal wheels. As a result, we always welcome donations of the following: Kaydee #5 couplers, metal wheel sets (such as Life-Like 33" or equal), motor cycle self-stick wheel weights (1/4 ounce sections), and Kaydee spacer washers (red or grey).

If you would like to supply any of the above items, feel free to bring them to the monthly club meeting this Thursday. Drop them off with either Penn or me. If you would like to take a look at the ID project and what the needs in construction are, we'll have the barn open after the September meeting. There are several areas open for club members to adopt.
