Special License Plate for Model Railroaders.

Mark Blaustein contacted us and is a member of the North Raleigh Model RR Club (NTrak) and the Carolina Piedmont Division 13 of NMRA. He writes:

I'm writing today to determine if there is any interest in having a special NC license plate promoting model rail-roading (similar to plates for Square Dancing or Purple Heart recipients). The requirements for presenting this bill are fairly simple: having 300 or more individuals who would order the plate; and that the representative organizations (ie, the NC train clubs) be not-for-profit.

From what I have been able to determine from NCDOT, the annual cost for the standard plate would be \$10 plus the regular license fee. If a personalized plate is desired, add another \$30 to the price. At this point, our next opportunity to get this in front of the state legislature would be the start of the next session in January 2011. This gives us some time to see how many folks would be interested in the plate, and then come up with a design.


